LSUHSCS Hospitals Win Quality Awards

All three teaching hospitals of the LSU Health Sciences Center at Shreveport-LSU Hospital in Shreveport, E.A. Conway Medical Center in Monroe and Huey P. Long Hospital in Pineville-have received prestigious Louisiana Hospital Quality Awards.

The Louisiana Hospital Quality Awards, bestowed by eQ Health Solutions (formerly Louisiana Health Care Review), recognize improved quality of patient care.

Eligibility is limited to hospitals active in clinical quality improvement in one or more of four clinical topics: Acute Myocardial Infarction (AMI), Heart Failure (CHF), Community-Acquired Pneumonia (PN), and Surgical Care Improvement (SCIP).

E.A. Conway in Monroe received the highest award, Platinum Level. Platinum level signifies improvement in each of the four clinical areas. Huey P. Long and LSU Hospital in Shreveport each received the Silver Award, which recognizes gains in two of the four areas. In order to be considered, a hospital must achieve at least 25 percent improvement from baseline to re-measurement or maintain a high level of performance greater than 90 percent. This is the second consecutive year in which all three hospitals of the LSU Health Sciences Center at Shreveport have been recognized by eQ Health Solutions with Louisiana Hospital Quality Awards.
